1. BACKGROUND:

- <u>Letters from 13 groups/agencies</u> concerned about rockweed protection
- Article (by RH Seeley and W. Schlesinger) on rockweed harvest impacts/sustainability

2. LEGAL ISSUE: who owns the rockweed?

- Conservation Law Foundation <u>letter</u>: ownership needs to clarified by court
- See King, 2009 white paper
- See Maine Attorney General office's opinions

3. MANAGEMENT ISSUE: what is the state doing to manage the harvest and protect coastal habitat?

- Maine <u>Rockweed Management Plan</u>, finished in Jan. 2014, but without the conservation (no-cut) areas set aside.
- Maine Rockweed <u>Conservation Working Group</u> has been meeting this year to designate no-cut areas. Listen to meeting recordings.
- Where does it stand now? NO-CUT areas have been proposed for <u>shorebird habitat</u> (scroll down the linked page) and seal pupping ledges.
- **STILL TO DO**: Designate NO-CUT areas for conservation lands, fish conservation areas, invertebrates.

4. LEGISLATIVE/ MUNICIPAL ISSUES: Can towns prohibit rockweed harvesting?

 LD 1143, sponsored by Rep. Tuell (E. Machias), proposes to allow towns to prohibit rockweed harvesting if a town by referendum votes to do that.

5. ACTION: What can groups, towns, counties, communities, conservation groups and individuals do to promote protection of rockweed habitat

(essential for supporting local fisheries and wildlife, and the jobs and incomes that come from local fisheries and wildlife)?
